Winningest Coach @ FSU and @ Miami
Leonard Hamilton, was named the National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times and the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association in 2009 Hamilton was the Washington Wizards' head coach in 2001 and the head coach at the University of Miami for ten years prior to that (1991-00) when he became the eighth head coach in Florida State men's basketball history. Named Big East Coach of the Year twice, and ACC Coach of the Year two times.

FSU is one of just 3 ACC teams that have won 60% or more of their games since the start of the 2005-06 season.

FSU won the ACC Title in 2012. Hamilton has taken his teams to 8 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post season tournaments
