Winningest Coach @ FSU and @ Miami

Leonard Hamilton, was named the National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times and the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association in 2009 Hamilton was the Washington Wizards' head coach in 2001 and the head coach at the University of Miami for ten years prior to that (1991-00) when

he became the eighth head coach in Florida State men's basketball history. Named Big East Coach of the Year twice, and ACC Coach of the Year two times.

FSU is one of just 3 ACC teams that have won 60% or more of their games since the start of the 2005-06 season.

FSU won the ACC Title in 2012. Hamilton has taken his teams to 8 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post season tournaments

Replaced Jeff Bzdelik(2014-15, after 4 years) who Replaced Dino Gaudio (3 years, 2007-08 thru 2009-10; Gaudio was assistant to Skip Prosser who died of heart attack in July 2007)

a McDonald's All-American at Page High School in Greensboro, a national player of the year who led Kansas to the 1988 NCAA championship and his 15 seasons in the NBA. Taking over Tulsa after spending nine seasons on the staff at Kansas – the final five as assistant to coach Bill Self – Manning compiled a 38-29 record the past two seasons with the Golden Hurricane. Tulsa caught fire to win 11 games down the stretch, tie for first in the C-USA with a 13-3 mark, beat Louisiana Tech 69-60 in the conference championship and earn the school's first berth to the NCAA Tournament since 2003. The Golden Hurricane lost its first NCAA Tournament game to UCLA 76-59.

2009	A-Farouk Aminu scored 17 points and Jeff Teague added 15 for Wake that never trailed in the game. Wake led 42-30 at the half, and then went on a 13-0 run early in the 2 nd half and took control FSU had a 3 game winning streak end. Toney Douglas scored a game high 22 points. FSU shot just 38% and made just 4 of 22 3pFG. FSU committed 18 turnovers
2010	Freshman Michael Snaer scored 14p and made clinching FTs with :04" left.FSU held Deacons leading scorer Al-Farouq Aminu scoreless for the first time in his career WF committed 20 turnovers. FSU shot 68% from the floor in the 2 nd half, and held Wake to just 34. FSU won rebound edge 34-28. Travis McKie was ACC scoring leader but scored just 3p in the game
